STUDYING CDU COURSES THROUGH BATCHELOR INSTITUTE

STUDY MODES

Internal: Living in Darwin or Alice Springs – every week attend lectures

External: Living anywhere in Australia / the world – every week go on-line

Mixed: Living anywhere in Australia – attend workshops + go on-line

LEARNING IN MIXED MODE

Intensive workshops for each unit of study are organised each semester (see individual course timetables), as well as on-line learning throughout the semester. (10 hours a week of independent study per unit, including engaging in on-line learning)

This mode of study involves attendance at intensive one-week workshops, held either on the CDU Casuarina Campus or alternatively on the main Batchelor Institute Campus, which is located in the town of Batchelor (100km from Darwin) as well as weekly engagement in the online learning environment. The advantage of this study means that students have opportunities to meet with other students as well as individual one-on-one guided support from their lecturers.
