ABOUT THE COURSE

This course describes the skills and knowledge required to perform Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) in line with Australian Resuscitation (ARC) guidelines; recognise and respond to life threatening emergencies and provide a First Aid response to a casualty. The course applies to all workers who may be required to provide an emergency first aid response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.

To maintain currency, this course need to be revised and reassessed every three years.

The CPR unit requires annual renewal.

Students must demonstrate at least two continuous minutes of CPR on an adult manikin on the floor and an infant on a hard surface.

Students will be issued a Statement of Attainment on the successful completion of all three units.

JOB ROLES

There are no job roles defined for this course.

PATHWAYS FROM THIS QUALIFICATION

After completing this course, the participant may continue to study further qualifications in this field including; HLTAID005 Remote first aid; HLTAID006 Advanced first aid HLTAID007 Advanced Resuscitation.

There are no entry requirements for this course.

Literacy and Numeracy

Minimum age for students

Students must meet the minimum age requirement to be able to enrol with Batchelor Institute. The minimum age will depend on several factors.

Where:

- Training is delivered in a regional or remote community, and the student no longer engages and/or participates in secondary schooling, the student must be 15 years or older at the time training commences
- Training is delivered on the Batchelor Campus or Desert People Centre Campus, and where the student attends training during the day, but are not accommodated overnight, the student must be 17 years or older at the time training commences; or
- Training is delivered in any location, and the student requires to be travelled by Batchelor Institute to a training delivery location, the student must be 18 years or older at the time training commences.

within their individual training plan and the support services will be arranged accordingly.
