Implement Traffic Management Plans

ABOUT THE COURSE

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to set out, monitor and close down traffic management plans and traffic guidance schemes in civil construction.

It applies to those working in supervisory roles. They generally work in teams in live traffic environments and hold some responsibility for the outcomes of others.

Licensing, legislative and certification requirements that apply to this unit can vary between states, territories, and industry sectors. Users must check requirements with relevant body before applying the unit.

Note: The terms Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) and Work Health and Safety (WHS) are equivalent and generally either can be used in the workplace. In jurisdictions where the National Model WHS Legislation has not been implemented registered training organisations are advised to contextualise the unit of competency by referring to the existing state/territory OHS legislative requirements.

Students undertaking this stand-alone course, are suggested to enrol in RIIWHS205E - Control Traffic with Stop-Slow Bat, as they are delivered simultaneously.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

All students must:

- Be 18 years or older, and
- Have completed CPCWHS1001 - Prepare to work safely in the construction industry or equivalent, or hold a current NT White Card

COURSE LOCATION, DURATION AND MODE OF STUDY

Locations: Batchelor Campus and remote communities with practical assessment conducted with an approved traffic management plan. Delivery locations are subject to sufficient demand and resources.

Duration: 2-3 days

Mode: On campus and on-site

Workshops: This course includes approx. 2-3-day workshop.

The workshop is delivered with 2 days of theory and theory assessment followed by 2 day practical training prior to assessment depending on students Competence. Where students do not reach the required level of proficiency, additional training will be offered. Once the student has attained the required level of proficiency, a Final Competency Assessment will occur.

Literacy and Numeracy

ABSTUDY

STUDENT TRAVEL

The Away from Base (AFB) Mixed-Mode program supports Indigenous students who are studying an approved mixed-mode course by distance education to access compulsory course elements in another location away from their permanent home for short periods of time.

A 'mixed-mode' AFB course is a nationally accredited course that is delivered through a combination of distance education and face-to-face residential teaching. AFB contributes towards the costs of travel, meals and accommodation.

If you have to attend a workshop away from your home, are in receipt of ABSTUDY and are enrolled in an ABSTUDY approved course, your travel, accommodation and meals will be organised by Batchelor Institute.

RECOGNISING YOUR KNOWLEDGE

Batchelor Institute recognises the importance of skills and knowledge that you may already have. You may have gained these through other work or study you have done or through life experience.
