

## Searching the library catalogue

Use main keywords when searching the library catalogue. For example, if you are searching for information about diabetes and Aboriginal people, enter the keywords **Aborigin\* diabetes**.

By placing the asterisk \* after Aborigin\* it will search for words such as Aboriginal, Aborigines, Aborigine, Aborigines.

The Boolean operator AND is automatically applied in the library database so there is no need to add AND between the two words. See *Search tips and tricks*.

Think about searching other terms such "Indigenous" and "First Nations".

## Search results

## Refine your search results

You can refine your search results by checking the boxes on the left-hand side column.

For this example, we have selected **Books (Print Book and eBook)**.

This now gives us 25 results.


## Sign in
